Welcome to our final monthly newsletter. As you are aware, Standage & Co Ltd (Standage) Have been carrying out refurbishment works on behalf of Southwark Council at Nelson Square Gardens. These works consisted of the following: drainage works to soil & vent pipes, minor brickwork and concrete repairs, Communal window repairs, new roofs or repairs where required, refurbishment of kitchens & bathrooms (providing that the Council's strict age criteria is met – 20 and 30 years of age respectively)), upgrading or installation of smoke alarms, exterior redecoration, front entrance door renewals and remedial works where required.

The scaffolding to all three blocks has now been struck and removed from site.

Standage & Co would like to thank all residents for their cooperation and understanding while these works have been going on.

We will however be re-attending early 2023 to carry out the replacement front entrance door works to the blocks as instructed by Southwark Council. Our site offices / compound outside Rowland Hill will remain in place until the front doors are complete.

All front entrance doors will be surveyed and will only be renewed based on condition. A ballot sheet has been sent out to all residents with the colour choices and designs for the new doors. We must advise that the decision for the final design and colour will be determined by the majority outcome of the ballot and that selecting an option does not guarantee that your preference will be provided should your door qualify for renewal.

These ballots will assist us when these works commence.

This months topic for our Environmental awareness is Carbon Footprint

So what is Carbon Footprint?

A carbon footprint is the amount of carbon emissions each person creates. Individuals can reduce this footprint and their effect on the environment, through use of renewable energy sources (solar power, geothermal heat pumps), recycling, and sustainable living.

There are many ways to reduce our carbon footprint, some are below.

Driving

- Alternatives to driving when possible, walk or ride your bike in order to avoid carbon emissions completely
- Drive a low carbon vehicle high mileage doesn't always mean low CO2 emissions.
- Driving style speeding and unnecessary acceleration reduce mileage by up to 33%.
- Tyre inflation and other tuning properly inflated tyres improves your gas mileage by up to 3%
- Avoid traffic being stuck in traffic wastes gas and unnecessarily creates CO2.

Reduce your home energy carbon footprint

- Insulate & seal your home reduce drafts and air leaks with caulk, insulation and weather stripping
- Appliances make energy efficiency a primary consideration when choosing a new dishwasher/refrigerator
- Lighting turn offlights you're not using and when you leave the room. Replace incandescent light bulbs with LED
- Thermostat don't set it too high or low.
 Install a programmable model to turn off the heat

Reduce your carbon footprint from food

- Eat locally-produced and organic food = it has been estimated that 13% of greenhouse gas emission result from the production and transport of food
- Cut the beef and dairy it takes a lot of resources to raise cows, and it's
 especially bad if you buy beef from somewhere like Brazil, where it was
 grazed on land that used to be tropical forest but was cleared for agricultural
 use
